Giving Thanks

"This is how we know love: Jesus laid down his life for us, and we ought to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters. 17 But if someone has material possessions and sees a brother or sister in need but refuses to help—how can the love of God dwell in a person like that?" 1 John 3:16-17 (CEB)

Thanksgiving has passed, and I hope and pray that your celebrations were filled with love, fellowship, and lots of good food. In the midst of all of the uncertainty and turmoil in the world, nation, and church, we affirm that God is good and that we are blessed. At Thanksgiving, we pause to remind ourselves and each other of all that God has given us.

Being thankful is about more than just gratitude; it is also about trust. A thankful heart trusts that God's blessings are without limit, although we don't get to decide what those blessings will be. We may not have all that we want, and we know that many do not have all that they need, but that is the result of the inequality and injustice of humanity. We hold onto what is "ours" for fear that we may not have enough tomorrow. While it is prudent to save, a thankful (and wise) heart will also grow in generosity because it trusts in God's provision. We possess many things, and a thankful and trusting heart protects us from being possessed by our possessions! We are possessed by our desires, our fears, and our doubts. A thankful heart and a trusting spirit enable us to be free to fully enjoy God's gifts to us.

Our churches have experienced decline in attendance and in stewardship over the years, and the continued viability of our churches is threatened. Understandably, that may make us want to hold on tight and conserve what we still have. We don't want our cherished churches to close like so many others have. But, often, we don't want them to change either. Yet, if things don't change, then we will continue down the road of decline and loss. I suggest that the way forward lies in thankful generosity, trusting that God will not fail to provide if we but trust God.

God has given us two great churches and the opportunity to build on what has come before to create something even better that will endure well into the future. Let us trust God with all that we have, giving to each other generously with thankful, trusting hearts. Do not worry about keeping things fair, but outdo one another in generosity, in grace, in love, and in faith. God is "all in" for us; let us be "all in" for what God is doing for us and with us. I trust that we will be quite grateful for the blessings that we will receive, and even more, I trust that the wider community around us will be grateful for how we will be a blessing to them.

May your Advent season be blessed, may your heart be warmed, and may your joy be made complete.

Merger Exploration Team Update and Reflection

Marriage, the courtship and proposal. The vision that our team has cast for the merger has been a marriage of two congregations. Our vision has been guided by Isaiah 43:19, "I am about to do a new thing; now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? I will make a way in the wilderness, rivers in the desert."

Our "new thing" began with a vision for the marriage of First and Woodmar. Together, we will make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world by strengthening our spiritual vitality in worship, our discipleship in opportunities to seek and grow in faith, our relational vitality by serving and celebrating our unique traditions, and our stewardship so that we can maintain a physical space as we impact our community.

Metaphorically speaking, courtships have peaks and valleys as they move along. This courtship has taken longer than expected as the data and details continue to be finalized. Amid the data and details, the courtship has been strengthened and the community has been impacted. Worshipping together on Sunday mornings has been hopeful as we combine our voices and receive inspiration from a message that reminds us that we are being held by our loving God who challenges us to reflect. Bible studies and Sunday school opportunities are growing as leaders step up as they feel called. Messy Church began in August with a dedicated team that brings joy and encouragement to families connected through our preschool, our church members, and through Brianna's Hope. Relational vitality is evident through shared meals and events such as United Women of Faith and mission opportunities. The combined monthly newsletter seeks to keep us connected through a shared vision and our opportunities.

So, how does our courtship move toward a proposal? As the task forces of Finance, Property and Staffing finalize details, the Merger Team will write a draft of a proposal. Steps will include recommendations from respective church councils, direction from our District Superintendent and retaining an attorney that specializes in non-profit mergers. The congregations will have opportunities to hear the proposal and gain clarification before a final vote is taken.

What will the proposal include? The name of our "new" church once it is determined. Location of our church and outreach ministries. The leadership structure will be included. Staff positions will be noted. Financial matters will be included. A timeline and determination of who can vote will be defined. How the vote will be determined will also be clarified.

To God be the glory as we move toward a proposal and hopefully marriage of our beloved churches.

FUMC Finance News

As of October 31, First Church's giving total for the year to date was \$130,449, which is \$40,233 behind contributions for the first ten months of 2023. This is reflected in the church's current expense fund deficit of \$43,336. The church is grateful to the First Church Foundation for the recent contribution of \$58,000 of a \$72,000 request to help offset the church's decline in giving projected through year's end.

The last date for which tithes and offerings can be attributed to 2024 is January 7. If you make a donation between January 1 and January 7 and want it to be counted for this year, be sure to clearly mark 2024 on your envelope. First Church is deeply grateful for your financial support, as well as your generous gifts of service in ministry.

Woodmar UMC Finance News

October ended with income over expenses of \$4,143. This was due to a final payment from the Ferrini Trust of \$11,117. Our offering for the month was \$5,702 and there were no unusual expenses. At the end of October, we had \$26,630 cash in the bank. Our Special Funds account currently has \$147,894 but we received our final bill of \$128,845 from Budd Mechanical for the chillers. This will deplete our Capital Campaign account, Phyllis Ferrini Trust Gift, and will greatly reduce our Property Maintenance Fund.

Community Preschool has expenses over income of \$18,562, mainly due to 3 payroll periods in October. At the end of October, they had \$92,602 in cash in the bank.

Woodmar Looking for New Custodians

Woodmar continues to seek a custodian and/or maintenance manager for the church building. These positions can be filled by one or two people. It is up to 30 hours a week, preferably during the daytime.

Woodmar also needs a special events manager, to set up the community center for people renting that room, usually most weekends. You would stay for the duration of the event, and then take down and clean up, 6-8 hours per event.
